**EDITORIAL** 

At the time of writing this editorial, events that encourage close contact among people are discouraged and local events are being cancelled. The usual list on pages 14 just gives you the contact details of clubs, so users can contact for mutual support.

It now looks unlikely that any of the events planned in Evington will go ahead this year.

This is probably the biggest existential threat in our lifetime and we must look after each other and keep safe. someone knocks on your door and says there are from the Evington Echo or another organisation, and offers to buy essential items for you, please take precautions:

- 1. Only buy essentials in this manner, so the amount of money required is minimal.
- 2. Do not hand over a bank card, use cash only.
- 3. Ask for an ID or verify their identity by calling the organisation they say they are from.

It is sad to hear of scams. People knocking on doors offering a doorstep test for Coronavirus and obviously for a hefty sum. Don't fall for it. They cannot do this.

Many of us already belong to organisations that are helping with vulnerable people in this crisis. If you don't then I would recommend listening to BBC Radio Leicester who wish to help coordinate volunteer efforts by putting people who need help in touch with those able to provide it. 

#### **DISTRIBUTION OF THE EVINGTON ECHO**

For 39 years, the Evington Echo has been distributed through doors through approximately 80 volunteers. We are grateful to so many people for their help with this.

Unfortunately, with the present crisis, we are unable to do this any more. Many

people are self-isolating and most people I speak to expect that there will soon be a clamp down. Also many Evington Echo distributors are now elderly. Over 70s are likely to be told to stay at home.

#### FRIENDS OF EVINGTON TRUSTEES

Friends of Evington welcome Samantha Woods and Gurpreet Kaur as new trustees, bringing the total to eight. See list of trustees on page 2.

Friends of Evington works with many organisations, particularly environmental organisations to promote our community and environmental aims. This year we had plans to set up a base at Hilltop allotments, developing a suitable sustainable community hut for teaching and events while supporting schools with their gardening projects.

Our partners at Graceworks have held two events this year

(1) In January, a climate change consultation to respond to Leicester City Council's Emergency Consultation.

A twenty-page response from 47 Evington people asked the Council to consider swift measurable change and impact assessments on clear targets with completion dates. The consultation group thought that the review of targets and aims must be open to public scrutiny and that the climate emergency sustainability plan MUST cut across all council policies, departments and actions.

(2) A day's course about 'One Planet Living' This is the start of thinking about living in a world where everyone everywhere lives happy, healthy lives within the limits of the planet, leaving space for wildlife and wilderness

Globally we are living as if we have more than one planet. The consumption in the Western Europe has been estimated to need three planets!

One Planet Living has created a sustainability framework with ten principles and detailed goals and guidance. The framework can help developers and housebuilders, businesses, local authorities, schools and community groups create a 'One Planet' action plan.

#### THE GENERAL HOSPITAL -THE FUTURE?

For several years now there have been questions raised about the future of The General. The managers of University Hospitals Leicester NHS Trust have regularly emphasised their desire to concentrate their main specialist activities and all acute clinical services on two sites -Glenfield and the Infirmary area while saying little about their plans for The General other than that it will be downgraded to some kind of Primary Care Hub without any in-patient beds. They have indicated that they will make final decisions about what will remain after the public has been consulted.

#### What could remain?

The Diabetes Centre, GP imaging (for example x-rays), primary urgent care treatment, observation area, service diagnostic providing appointments for people to have a test or simple procedure, community outpatients services and potentially extra primary care capacity to provide family health care to people living in the east of the city.

Significantly, they want to test out

the viability of establishing a new stand-alone midwifery-led unit on the site. They indicate that they will try it for one year only. At least 500 babies will have to be born in the unit for it to be considered viable; if fewer babies are born there during that year, the unit will be closed without further consultation.

meantime. In the all maternity and neo-natal specialist services will be moved from the General to a maternity hospital new which is to be built on the Infirmary site.

#### **Background information which could** be relevant:

\*Previously, the Leicester Hospitals' bid was for £367 million. Recently, it has been reported that they have been granted £450 million.

\*To achieve this funding, the Trust had to identify land that it no longer requires so that it can be considered for housing. The UHL NHS Trust managers have identified 70 acres of land at the General Hospital site.

\*Concerns have been raised about

the number of in-patient beds which the Trust is planning to provide. The managers have raised the number slightly but, given the expansion of housing in the Leicester area (in Evington alone 585 more houses are planned), the number of beds proposed appears totally inadequate. Worryingly, the Trust managers base their calculations on the HOPE /ASSUMPTION that the problems of community care provision will have been solved and the community will be able to make up for a shortfall in the number of beds.

\*Recent events have also highlighted the fact that hospitals need to have plenty of spare capacity in order to provide isolation wards to problems cope with such as Coronavirus.

\*There have been many complaints for several years about the difficulty of actually getting to the Infirmary, with roads sometimes grid-locked near the site and parking well-nigh impossible at times. This problem will only be made even worse if the new maternity hospital is located on the Infirmary I doubt if many expectant mothers would choose to have their

baby born in an ambulance – or a car!

\*A recent investigation by the Department of Health has found that NHS Trusts may be disregarding NICE guidelines with regard to the information they should be giving to expectant mothers about pain relief.....that if they choose to give birth at home or in a midwife-led unit, they may have to be transferred if they want an epidural, because a doctor would then be required. Transfer would also be needed, of course, if any complications arose. It would seem advisable, therefore, to locate the midwife-led unit as close to the main hospital as possible, ideally on the site currently designated for the new maternity hospital. The new maternity hospital itself could then be located on the General Hospital site where it would also be more accessible for women who choose to

give birth at home but later find that they need to transfer. This arrangement would seem to cater much better for the needs of expectant mothers.

#### **Consultation:**

NHS bosses have talked about consulting the public about their plans but, as yet, we have received no information about how, where, and when this consultation will take place.

#### What can we do?

#### **KNIFE CRIME**

Dear Editor,

I was interested in your article about knife crime (Issue 282 p. 5).

Following a 2018 UK wide ballot of 1.1 million young people aged 11 to 18, knife crime was declared their biggest concern. A special committee (in anticipation of the Government's response) makes the following main recommendations:

- 1. Look at the injustices that make some young people vulnerable to the draw of violence and gangs.
- 2. Follow this with a long term funding plan (at least 5 years) of effective ways of reaching these vulnerable people at risk.

If we want to stop the causes of the rise of knife crime, we must improve the difficult circumstances some young people are facing.

#### POLICE AND CRIME COMMISSIONER ELECTIONS



Elections for the Police and Crime Commissioners for England and Wales due to take place on 7th May have been cancelled because of the Coronavirus epidemic. Some Evington residents may have received a leaflet for the Leicestershire PCC job. DO NOT GO AND VOTE. These elections will not take place until May 2021.

All politicians have agreed that in view of the Coronavirus pandemic it is best to cancel.

WHAT DOES THE POLICE AND CRIME COMMISSIONER DO FOR YOU?

\*Funds crime prevention services to address issues such as drug and alcohol misuse, youth crime and anti-social behaviour to keep your communities safe.

\*After consulting local people, publishes a Police and Crime Plan to identify local priorities and how they plan to meet them.

\*Works with national and local policing and Criminal Justice partners to reduce crime and help make communities safer.

\*Works with local authorities, health and education services, plus the voluntary sector and local businesses to create a joined-up response to local problems.

\*Sets the police budget, decides how much you pay towards policing from your council tax, to add to the funding from central Government, and decides how that combined money is spent.

\*Appoints the Chief Constable who runs the operational side of policing in your force area.

\*Holds the Chief Constable to account for delivering an effective and efficient police service.

The PCC is elected every four years to represent your views on policing and crime locally. He/she is directly accountable to you, the public.

#### **EVINGTON KARATE CLUB**



Around 15 years ago I founded Evington Karate Club after 10 years karate experience and reaching the level of 2nd Dan Black Belt. I was born in Evington more years ago than I

would like to mention and lived there all my life. I started the club because I always had a strong connection with Evington and thought it was a shame that when my son wanted to start martial arts I had to travel out of Evington to find a good class. The club was originally based at the General Hospital Sports and Social Club for several years. We then moved briefly to the Evington Boys Club before settling at our present training venue the Evington Leisure Centre.

The aim of Evington Karate Club has always been to train students of all ages independent of gender, religious beliefs or ethnic background.

At Evington Karate we teach a form of karate called Wado which I feel is possibly the most comprehensive style as it has the most in depth syllabus. We teach the basics of punching, blocking, pad work, sparring, throws and ground work but also the traditional katas and pair work that many clubs don't.

Although Wado karate is an old traditional



style, I find the moves are still very relevant today not only as a good solid self defence system but also for fitness and flexibility.

Although karate is all about kicks and punches, we build our training around self defence with emphasis on how to avoid violence and evade strikes. Along with the obvious benefits of training in martial arts we also find our students benefit from the discipled classes and the way we build confidence in our students.

I believe in teaching karate in a disciplined but also friendly way: I find that relaxed but motivated students learn a lot quicker.

I don't believe in wasting a student's time doing ridiculously hard exercises during a karate lesson. Of course fitness is important but good technique and timing are far more important.

We are a family friendly club with parents training alongside children and teenagers. Each student is helped to reach their personal best by working to their own capabilities.

Karate has been a hobby for me for over 25 years and I was determined that when I started Evington Karate it would be a club and not a business. This means we keep the joining costs as low as possible, and ongoing expenses such as yearly licences, karate uniforms and grading costs to a minimum. Too many clubs are all about how much money they can make and push students through expensive gradings every few weeks. I believe students work best at their own speed and will learn at a different pace, so our students only grade when the instructors and more importantly, when the student feel they are ready. Our gradings are not easy, nothing worth having is easy, but with the right training and personal commitment they are achievable. All our instructors are very experienced 3rd Dan black belts, DBS checked and qualified first aiders; we take the health and safety of our students very seriously.

At Evington Karate Club we are very open about what and how we teach. Our classes are open to anybody who feels they may be interested in karate. Ask me as many questions as you like.

#### WOMEN OF LEICESTER



Elizabeth Frisby MBE, suffragette, arsonist, councillor, JP and Lord Mayor

The Parish Centre at St Denys was packed on 13th February for an illustrated talk by renowned local historian and guide Virginia Wright on 'Women of Leicester' to the Evington History and Heritage Group.

A surprise opening was to discover just how long ago the first of these Leicester women made her presence felt. A neatly-graffitied shard of Roman Samian-ware pottery, unearthed in 1854 near the Jewry Wall, tells of the love of actress Verecunda and gladiator Lucius. More well-known is the history of Alfred the Great's impressive daughter Æthelflæd , the Lady of the Mercians , who from her base at Tamworth drove the Danes from Leicester in 918. Her much-stolen bronze statue is now sheltered in the courtyard of Leicester's Guildhall. In Georgian times Birmingham-born Mary Linwood ran a school for young ladies in Belgrave Gate that was to

retain her name for more than a century , but was better-known for striking reproductions of Old Master paintings in embroidery that won international acclaim, especially in Russia. She met most of the crowned heads of Europe and dined with Napoleon. Victorian Mary Royce was Leicester's first female doctor, practising in Saxby St. from 1890.

Leicester's women were in the forefront of the struggle - often physical - for Women's Suffrage in the years before the First World War. Factory worker suffragette Alice Hawkins has finally been rewarded with a statue in the remodelled Leicester Market Place. Ellen Sherriff and Elizabeth Frisby were radicals believing in direct action, from pouring ink into pillar-boxes to the burning down of Blaby railway station. Miss Frisby was to remain involved in public affairs her whole life. She served time in Holloway Prison for protests outside Parliament in 1910 and 1911 but received the MBE in 1918 for both funding and staffing refreshment facilities for the troops. She would go on to become a magistrate, a Conservative Councillor and eventually the first female Lord Mayor of Leicester in 1941.

Mary Attenborough was not just the mother of two of Leicester's most famous sons but in the 1930s was the prime mover in housing first Basque refugee children from the Spanish Civil War and later German Jewish girls at Evington

Very close to our own time, Leicester was the birthplace of two pioneering female Mary Stott and Hollingsworth. Mary went straight from Wyggeston Girls' School to the Leicester Mail but was best known as a long-serving editor of the Womens' Page in the Guardian, moving such writing away from recipes and knittingpatterns to modern discussions of issues affecting women. Claire Hollingsworth, recently deceased aged 105, was the reporter who spotted the massing of German troops on the Polish border in September 1939 and broke the news to the world in the Daily Telegraph. After many years service as a War and Defence Correspondent, she became the Telegraph's China Correspondent, retiring to Hong Kong.

An informative and entertaining evening bringing some of our local heroines into the limelight.

The History and Heritage group will not meet again until September.

#### **BODY AWARENESS SCAN**

Body awareness scan is when we pay attention to parts of our body in a gradual sequence from feet to top of the head by mentally scanning each area. This practice is done by you by bringing your awareness to parts of the body in sequence.

Body awareness scan helps to relieve stress and strengthens the link between the mind and the body.

Practice this laying down on your back, feet slightly apart relaxed and arms by your side palms facing upwards and relax the whole body. I personally prefer to do the body awareness scan just before I fall sleep, this helps my body and mind to be in a complete relaxed state. Start off by softly closing your eyes, slowing the breathing down, letting your abdomen expand and contract with each breath, nice slow deep inhales and exhales for a minute or so.

Start the body awareness scan from the feet, pausing for a few seconds before moving onto the next part. Up to ankles, calves, knees and so on and so forth all the way up to the top of you head. Scan your entire body. Are there any areas that have discomfort, aches, pains or tension? If there are any areas with this continue to breathe into these areas and visualise it leaving your body through your breath into the air. Move on to the next when you feel you are ready.

When you have completed releasing bring your awareness back to your breath, nice slow deep inhales and exhales for a moment or so to end the body awareness scan practice.

I hope you enjoy doing this practice and do give me your feedback.

#### SITES FOR HOUSES

The Leicester City Council has identified 83 Leicester sites where thousands of new homes could be built. This list has been narrowed down from 240 suggested two years ago.

City Mayor, Sir Peter Soulsby, says this is the start of a conversation about how the city grows and will focus on other key future issues such as transport, retail and tackling the climate emergency. The land in Evington that has been earmarked is as follows:

#### Leicester General Hospital

The NHS trust says there is just over 70 acres of brownfield land surplus to requirements. 532 homes could be built. (See further articles in this issue on pages 4 and 5.)

#### Judgemeadow Community College Playing Fields

Another part of the school playgrounds earmarked for 9 homes.

#### **Linden School Playing Fields**

The Evington school could get 17 homes built where the grounds front onto Headland Road.

#### Sedgebrook Road Open Space

An Evington site that could take 14 houses.

#### Land adjacent to Evington Leisure Centre

15 homes could be built on a plot of land facing Downing Drive.

#### **Land North of Gartree Road**

An Evington site where 30 homes are proposed.

#### Land between Coleman Road and Goodwood Road

A greenfield site in Evington where eight homes could be built.

#### **Kingscliffe Crescent open Space**

11 homes could be built on this Evington site.

#### JEAN KHOTE (1943-2020)



Jean was Labour councillor for North Evington Ward from 2011. A fellow councillor, Diane Cank, said "Jean was a lovely lady, extremely generous, warm and funny and one of the hardest working councillors around, but she never stood for any silly stuff."

She always listened to the concerns of her constituents and had dedicated her life to politics, coming first from South Africa during the apartheid days, then to London as a councillor before moving to Leicester.

Abdul Osman said "she was passionate about her politics and her policies. She was interested in International politics and would recount stories of her time in South Africa".

Jean was a feminist and carried the flag for women's rights. She supported the Muslim Women's Network, UK, which campaigns for women to be heard and empowered within the Muslim community. Jean was also the disability officer for Leicester East Labour and campaigned for carers (mostly women) because they got a rough deal and needed better pay and working conditions.

Even in hospital, Jean arranged for food donations to be delivered to a food share scheme.

The Leicester-based Federation of Muslim Organisations said, "Her selfless contribution for the community was immense".

She leaves a husband, son, daughter and grandchildren.





#### LEICESTERSHIRE WARDEN SCHFMF

Cleaning up our streets and countryside currently costs the taxpayer almost £800 million a year and so maximum on-the-spot fines for dropping litter have been increased to £150 - in order to deter and punish the antisocial minority who continue to drop rubbish. The law has also changed in that the registered keeper is responsible for ANYONE who litters from their car and it is them who will receive the £150 fine.

Leicester City Council is working with all the other Leicestershire Councils on a joint campaign to raise awareness of these changes and to do targeted enforcement in hot spot areas.

The offence is now civil not criminal which means if anyone has any dashcam or CCTV footage and are willing to give a statement so we can do a DVLA check (not a statement to go to court) then we can collect this and use the footage. #### **Editorial Comment:**

The City Wardens were shortlisted for 2 awards in the Waste Performance of the Year category and Outstanding Service Delivery Award in Keep Britain Tidy's annual awards, and won the award for Outstanding Service Delivery. It followed a successful 9 monthong campaign to tackle flytipping, side waste, bins on the street and other waste issues in the city's Fosse ward in 2019, which involved inspecting 117 businesses, 16 of which were issued with fines totalling £4,800.

The work led to an 18 percent reduction in flytipping and a nine percent increase in people using council services, such as bulk waste collection, compared to the same period in 2018. The Keep Britain Tidy awards celebrate the very best councils from across the UK, highlighting those who are making significant improvements to the local environment in communities.


