#### **Road Safety**

A road traffic collision on Spencefield Lane involving an 11-year student from St. Paul's Catholic School has reignited a debate about how to make Evington roads safer.

Leicestershire Police and East Midlands Ambulance Service were in attendance and members of the public helped by comforting the young victim and alerting the emergency services. By the time you read this we expect the boy will have made a full recovery.

Generally traffic improvement measures are as follows:

Improving bus services to the area Park and Stride

Working with parents and schools, to improve traffic flow and parking in drop off zones in the area.

More traffic wardens to monitor parking 20mph zones

A pedestrian crossing
ANPR cameras to monitor speeds

Once a quietish country lane, Spencefield Lane was redesignated as a B road to connect different neighbourhoods in Evington and to feed traffic between the A47 and smaller roads. As such, unfortunately, this makes it problematic, if not impossible, for its conversion to a 20mph zone.

Principal of St Paul's, Shelley Conaghan, said "It is obvious to everyone that it is not safe to park along Spencefield Lane on both sides of the road. Parents need

somewhere to park safely and it is our preferred option to have a park and stride car park serving our schools. A school crossing outside the school gates and double yellow lines on Spencefield Lane would safeguard all the students going to and from school."

Evington Councillors Deepak Bajaj, Zuffar Haq and Jenny Joannou have been in discussions with the Heads of St Paul's RC School and Krishna Avanti on how to make dropping-off and pick-up times safer for pedestrians and drivers. They told the Echo "We are committed to finding solutions and we are exploring options for this school." Problems around the 13 other schools in this area also need discussing for better ways forward.

St Paul's has been lobbying the council for a year but Assistant Mayor Councillor Adam Clarke, who has specialised in Transport Strategy, strongly denied that the recent collision was the key motivating factor for a renewed priority to road safety. "It would be wrong to assume the cause of this accident until we are in receipt of the police's findings. We are keen to ensure that there is a package of measures planned for delivery as quickly possible." He explained that "Spencefield Lane is a priority due to the recognised issues of high traffic volume, inconsiderate parking, and the overall need to reduce the volume of car usage in travelling to and from schools across the

Community consent is essential if there is

to be compliance to any eventual policy change. A meeting for parents and residents is planned for September at St. Paul's. Please check the Evington Echo website for more details.

#### The Green Bicycle Mystery

When I first came to Evington in 1981, I attended a lecture by Mr. Macintosh, who had written a small pamphlet about the death of Bella Wright. Mr. Macintosh was very sorry to hear that Bella had an unmarked grave and wanted to write the pamphlet to raise enough money to buy a headstone for her in Stoughton Church's graveyard.

Bella Wright had lost her life on Saturday 5<sup>th</sup> July 1919, when she cycled back to Stoughton from her uncle's house in Gaulby. She had been followed by a man riding a green bicycle.

Mr. Macintosh weighed up the evidence and concluded that this was a 'Cold Case

Jury' in his book and lecture. This means readers make up their own minds about

the case. Afterwards I asked him his personal opinion. He said, "Ronald Light killed her, but was well defended by an extremely clever lawyer called Edward Marshall-Hall who managed to persuade the jury to acquit him. Ronald Light then moved to Kent and married at the age of 49. He died at the age of 89. Mr. Macintosh had contacted Ronald Light's widow and

informed her of the trial. A trial that had been reported both nationally and internationally. The widow had suspected her deceased husband had a secret history.

When Bella Wright's body was found by the side of Gartree Road, near Little Stretton, it looked like a traffic accident.

An astute policemen later examined the body more closely and noticed a bullet wound. So a hue and cry went up to find the culprit who shot her. The case went cold until eight months later a green bicycle was dredged up from the canal with its number plate rubbed off. This bicycle was traced back to Ronald Light.

After the trial, Ronald Light was able to make a safe confession, because what he said wouldn't be opened for 100 years. In 2019, the envelope was opened.

Ronald Light confessed to manslaughter. A book by Antony M. Brown called "The Green Bicycle Mystery' thoroughly looks through the evidence. As with all the books written about this case, readers are asked to make up their own minds, but Antony Brown's opinion is that Ronald Light murdered Bella. Admitting to manslaughter was another deception by Ronald Light he argued.

This story has fascinated people because of the time period, just after the First World War. Bella had been in service and then found a job in a rubber factory and enjoyed the company of the other girls and more free time.

Ronald Light had been training to be an officer during the war, but then "wasn't officer material". Was important evidence ignored at the trial?



If I can help in anyway, I will. I am now 71 but am determined to do my best for Evington.



#### **Apples to Foodbanks**



The October/November 2022 issue of the Evington Echo reported that after an appeal, local residents donated more than one ton of fruit, mainly apples from their own gardens, to a local foodbank at Wesley Hall.

Now elected a councillor in May 2023, Cllr. Zuffar Haq will coordinate this scheme again and in cooperation with local residents, not for profit groups, local businesses and local charities. He plans to improve on the 2022 target, aiming for 2 tons of apples and other fruit to go to Wesley Hall food bank.

Locally grown fruit helps feed people under the poverty line. It hasn't travelled far and is a healthy food option.

After attending the City Council's launch of their food strategy on 6<sup>th</sup> June, Cllr. Zuffar Haq said, "There is a lot of work to be done in Leicester to help people living





below the poverty line. One step forward, which I am pleased to report, is that there are plans to plant more orchards in parks and open spaces and plans to work with food partners to improve the quality and sustainability of food in schools."
