



Our youngest children from Nursery, Reception and Key Stage 1, are back at school, consequent to a number of safety works that were carried out by the Local Authority. They are thrilled to be back, and enjoying all of the wonderful facilities that are now available to them.

The children in Key Stage 2 remain at the Temporary Modular School (TMS) we have created at Judgemeadow, and have been made to feel very welcome indeed by Principal Jason Smith, and the wider Lionheart Educational Trust. These arrangements are in lieu of a Temporary Modular School that will be built on the Ethel Road Playing Fields.

# ISLAMIC RELIEF RAISE FUNDS FOR THE MOROCCAN EARTHQUAKE APPEAL



### TONY HIRD 14.12.1917 – 08.06.2023



Tony Hird lived in and around Evington for all of his long life.

He was the oldest child of Harold and Gwendoline Hird and they lived together on Kedlestone Road. His grandfather was also called Harold and worked at Steels and Busks, an engineering factory on Temple Road.

Tony went to the City Boys' Grammar School on Humberstone Gate. During the war the building was deemed to be unsafe because of the bombs, so they shared Wyggeston Boys' School, with the boys alternating lessons every other week to be either in the mornings or afternoons.

Tony enjoyed sport and adventure and was in the 9th Leicester Scouts with his friend Geffrey Simson and the three Attenborough boys, Richard, David and Jonathan. They went to Yorkshire camping and did the Three Peaks Challenge.

Tony helped his Uncle Herbert on Saturdays in his estate agency business and often went on holiday with this uncle and his aunt. Uncle Herbert's partner had a daughter called Sheila, who Tony married years later.

At the age of 19, Tony was called into the army and was with the royal artillery, guarding the convoys that came into Pembroke Docks in Wales. Whilst in the army he played the piano in a 4-piece band and also played twice a week in the sergeants' mess. This meant he could never go home!

After two years in the army, Tony went on a road trip with his friend, David Herbert, whom he sat next to in alphabetical order at school. They drove to France and Italy. Tony had never been abroad before. This started a life-long interest in travel.

Although Tony initially worked in property, he decided on a career change and studied as a quantity surveyor on a 4 year part-time course in Leicester on Building and Quantities, completing this course successfully in 1951. 1951 was also

the year he married Sheila, who he had met again on a bus.

Tony had a long career as a surveyor, working with both the City and County Councils. He supervised the task of 'rebuilding Britain' after the 2nd World War, when Leicester built nearly 1,000 houses each year in the public sector. Tony also supervised the planning and construction of swimming pools in both the City and the County.

Tony was a family man, providing stable homes for his wife and two children, Barbara and Andrew. He built his own house on Roundhill Road, then built a house on Hawthorn Drive and a bungalow in Evington Lane, opposite Gisborne Court.

For the last 50 years of his life he lived in a Jelson house in Fairford Avenue, off Biggin Hill Road. His children remember him as an outdoor man, taking them on camping trips as far away as Costa Brava in Spain. They had short camping breaks at East Runton in Norfolk and remember sailing at Poole in Dorset. They also remember the many cycling and swimming outings and the allotments on Ethel Road where Tony grew Brussel sprouts, leeks and potatoes.

"His was a very fulfilling life" said Barbara, his daughter. "He will be greatly missed". Barbara



### Nigel Anderson Graham King 14 June 1943 – 6 March 2023



In March, we sadly bid farewell to a much-loved friend: Nigel King. He was a very popular and well-regarded man, reflected by the sheer number of people who

came to pay their respects. After valiantly battling cancer for many years, he passed away peacefully at LOROS, surrounded by his loved ones.

Rev. Anthony Lees-Smith, leading the celebration of Nigel's life, told that he was born in 1943 to teachers Vi and Arthur in Sunderland. Growing up happily in Bedford with his younger sister, Diana, he enjoyed playing with many friends and listening to the music of the day on the King's record player – the first of his peers to buy records by Buddy Holly, Fats Domino and others. The seeds for travelling the world were sown very early on; he would pore over books full of blue skies and sandy beaches in preparation for his parents' emigration to Australia. Although that never materialised, wanderlust had firmly taken root...

Inspired by his art teacher father, Nigel was always creative. He studied Architectural Design at Leicester and then Manchester, where he met the love of his life and future wife, trainee teacher, Margaret. One day, Nigel was surprised to spot Margaret, standing on the saddle of her bike, peering in through his window! She was trying to see into the house as there was a room to rent – being a perfect gentleman, Nigel invited her in for a proper look – as they say, the rest is history!

Following university, Nigel spent much of his 20s on an epic voyage, hitch-hiking and taking ships, trains, planes and automobiles across Turkey, Afghanistan, India and Indonesia to Darwin, Australia. He worked as a ship's cook, fruit salesman, road construction worker and driver to fund exploring the marvels of 'down -under' - Ayres Rock, Alice Springs, The Great Barrier Reef and Sydney, before (briefly) returning to his career as an architect and family life in England.

Marrying Margaret in 1978, they had a blissful marriage in the fun and relaxed atmosphere of 70s and 80s London, with Nigel working on the development of St Katherine's Dock and the restoration of Kensington Palace.

However, the lure of travelling the world proved too great; in 1982 they spent 7 months trekking in Sri Lanka, India, Kashmir and the Himalayas. Another idyllic lifestyle followed, with Nigel working as a handyman at a picturesque woodland barn, near Margaret's mother's German family near Hamburg.



In 1987, the couple and their new son, Robert, settled in Ingarsby Drive in Evington, next door to Margaret's parents, Hella and David. Nigel worked for many years at County Hall, with Margaret teaching, most recently at Whitehall. He was a devoted husband and father; he cherished his family. Happy times were spent camping in UK and Europe and tending their family allotment at Evington Hilltop.

Unfortunately, their retirement plans were marred when both Margaret and Nigel were diagnosed with cancer. Sadly, Margaret passed away shortly after, in 2013. Nigel had cared for her devotedly despite being ill himself, and was obviously devastated. However, he managed to pick himself up by throwing himself into his art and his allotment (recently shared with and passed onto Robert's partner Joanna.)

A talented artist, Nigel was a keen member of Leicester Sketch Club, Crown Hills, Oadby and Houghton Art Societies. He took over the reins of Peter Sumpter's art class following Peter's death, giving it a new twist during covid restrictions. Unable to meet in person, Nigel set a topic for the class, forming inspiring collages of the group's

artworks. He also co-ordinated the community collage celebrating St Denys Church's 800th anniversary. He often had paintings accepted into the Leicester Open Exhibition; recently colourful paintings of local garage mechanics at work and renovations underway at Foxton Locks. He loved experimenting with different art styles, including abstract art, lino and screen printing. He was also a keen photographer and birdwatcher.

Taking up folk dancing at Burton Overy, he became friends with Jennifer. They had many shared interests including theatre,

cinema, concerts and visiting the Botanic Gardens, as well as trips throughout Britain, bringing much happiness to them both during Nigel's last years.

Welcoming grand-daughter Emily into the world in 2019, he loved helping her draw and paint, passing his skills onto a new generation. He embraced her enthusiasm for 'helping' at the allotment and her passion for collecting

worms and creepy-crawlies! He was a real family man!

Personally, I have had the honour of Nigel and Margaret's friendship for the last 18 years - they were both true friends. Nigel was always so inspiring and creative - he always had something interesting to discuss and offered fascinating insights into the wider world. I will miss our chats and his warm, welcoming nature - he had such a lust for life! He was always upbeat and never complained despite countless bouts of had chemotherapy. He boundless enthusiasm for trying new things - when a challenge arose, he always said, "I think I can handle it."

Nigel will be fondly remembered for his sense of principle, his creative mindset and above all, his generosity and kindness of spirit. That kindness was reflected in everything he did and said. He was a gentle, modest, community-focused man who put the needs of others before his own.

Our thoughts go out to Robert, Joanna, Emily and Jennifer. Nigel will be greatly missed by all who knew and loved him.

These are some of the tasks I have undertaken during the last few weeks.

### **EVINGTON VILLAGE SCHOOL**

In Memory of Michael Daly

I am very grateful to Michael's family for passing on documents collected by him. Before he died, Michael was working on a history of the Evington Village School and was searching for pictures and other information.

Michael writes: "The site of a very early school in School Lane was recorded in the old village records as dating from 1768 to

1770. In 1841 there was a "Promoting school Education of the Poor in the Principle of the Established Church". It was financed by Miss Henry Burnaby who inherited Evington House in 1850 and lived there for the following 30 or more years as the owner. Miss Henry Burnaby was an unmarried daughter of Colonel John Burnaby who had bought Evington House and extended it considerably for his dream retirement home.

The school was very popular and by 1846/47 it was extended – a gallery was removed and a 2nd classroom for infants was added Also in the pictures above you see the school house on the left for the Headteacher.

Old Evington Village School became a Church of England school in 1903. Miss Henry Burnaby visited weekly for almost all her life and on high days and holidays invited pupils to tea in the grounds of Evington House. She presented a harmonium to the school which was still there when Michael was a pupil between 1937 and 1945.

When Michael was at the school, Miss Lottie Wilkinson was the headteacher and taught juniors in the main larger classroom. There were two other teachers for nursery and infants in the smaller room to the rear of the building. Miss Wilkinson taught five individual year groups in one classroom and was excellent, said Michael.
