






Editorial

A DEFIBRILLATOR FOR EVINGTON VILLAGE



With local stakeholder groups that support Friends of Evington, we are pleased to announce that thanks to a £750 donation from the British Heart Foundation and another a n o n y m o u s resident's donation of £500, we are on the way to reaching

our target goal of £2,285. The total cost of the defibrillator and cabinet is £1,500 and then hidden costs include installation and maintenance, so the goal is £2,285.

The plan is to have a defibrillator on the forecourt of the Cedars, on the restaurant side. This is always open, so is in easy access. I am also assured that this Mindray CIA Automatic Defibrillator and external heated cabinet with a key pad lock will have full instructions for use. It will be registered with the Ambulance Service.

We are asking residents for help with donations. If you have any bric-a -brac, please donate it at The Cedars and there will be an ongoing table of items to purchase for £1. There will also be other events like bingo sessions, quiz nights and special coffee mornings. Keep a look out on the Community Noticeboards in the Village and especially in the Cedars.

"If this defibrillator enabes us to save just one life, then it will be worth it." said Karl, Manager of the Cedars.

This picture shows rubbish that was dumped on Hawthorne Drive, near the turning to Linden Drive. It was cleared away by Leicester City Council. The law on fly tipping states that it is the illegal dumping of waste on land or water punishable by fines or imprisonment.

Residents' expectations are that Leicester City Council will use the information supplied to City wardens by a vigilant member of the public, to follow this up and try to secure a prosecution.

This is a breach of social responsibility to neighbours and the local community from the people involved in the fly tipping.

Residents in Leicester City who see this happening need to call the City wardens on 4543110.

Rob Watson, a trustee of Friends of Evington said, "I have just reported some dumped furniture on my street with the 'Love Clean Streets' app. and it was promptly cleared. If you want lower council taxes, this kind of antisocial behaviour has to stop."

To download 'Love Clean Streets' app. on your phone:

For Android devices visit Google Play Store and search 'Love Clean Streets'. For iphone users go to the Apple Store and search 'Love Clean Streets'.

Install by clicking on the 'Install' or 'Get' button. Once installed, open the app. and follow the simple four-step process to report environmental issues like flytipping, graffiti, dog mess, illegal parking, problems in parks and open spaces or potholes.

Junk mail is unsolicited mail sent to householders, usually advertising a product or service (e.g. home insurance) by a commercial company.



DOUGLAS SMITH 1930 – 2024



Douglas Smith. Architect and Artist, lived in Evington with his wife Shirley, in a bungalow he built himself off Spencefield Lane.

Douglas studied art and architecture at Cheltenham College and Leicester School of Architecture (now De Montfort University). He set up a successful, multidisciplinary practice in Leicester called Douglas Smith Stimpson Partnership, which has made significant

contributions to Leicester City's architecture.

In 1988, when Bryan Organ came to the end of his term of office as President of the Leicester Society of Artists, Douglas was invited to be President and held that position for 27 years.

Douglas had an insatiable love of travel and art. Throughout his long and distinguished career as an architect, Douglas enthusiastically followed his passion for painting

and sketching.

The Evington Echo was privileged to write about his book called 'Tuscany' and also his book of painting and sketches called 'Leicester'.

Reprinted here is a picture of the front cover December 2009 Evington Echo, which shows some of his sketches of Leicester buildings.

At the end of his life, Douglas was cared for by his son, Adrian, and Adrian's family.

PLANTING TREES FOR **BIODIVERSITY AND CARBON CAPTURE**




'More Trees Please' is a very large project involving many charities and councils across England to encourage tree planting. Their ambition is to plant 700 million trees by 2030 and 1.5 billion trees in the UK by 2050. In Leicestershire the target is to plant 700,000 trees between 2020 and 2025.

Nearer to home, over the last two years, Leicester City Council, working with the environmental charity 'Earthwatch Europe', helped the City of Leicester College to plant 600 trees. Students planted these trees in the school grounds as part of their geography lessons. Judgemeadow Community College have worked with Leicester City Council on a Tiny Forest project as part of LCC's Sustainable Schools Programme. The tiny forest at Judgemeadow also includes a classroom area with benches to encourage classes to learn in a natural environment.

Sedgebrook Open Space Gardeners, a registered 'It's Your Neighbourhood' (IYN) group supported by our own charity, Friends of Evington / Evington in Bloom, held a tree planting session involving local residents, on 28th March.

Colin Chapman's mother, Ella Margaret Chapman (10.08.1916 - 27.05.2008), also attended the village school, as did some of Colin's older relatives. Many older Evington residents will remember Ella Chapman because she collected many photographs of Evington and kept meticulous records.

She was the oldest of five siblings born during and after the First World War. But all of her three sisters and one brother died in infancy from tuberculosis. Only Ella Chapman survived. Then her father died in 1925, so Ella 's mother returned to Evington and Ella attended Evington C of E school until 1927. She then gained a scholarship and attended Leicester Collegiate School until 1931. A year before, in 1930, Ella's mother purchased the two cottages at the corner of Church Road and High Street from an auction of the Evington Hall and Estate held on 13th May 1930, which was land the businessman and philanthropist for Evington, Mr. John Edward Faire, had purchased from the 1913 auction of the huge Stoughton Estate.





Ella trained to be a hairdresser and secretary before working for an electrical shop on Melton Road, Belgrave, Leicester. At the shop she met Cedric Arthur Chapman, who had also lost his father in the First World War. In September 1939, they married and went to live at the last cottage on Thurnby Lane, Stoughton. It turned out that her mother, grandmother and great grandmother had also been born in the same cottage. During the 2nd World War, Cedric worked on the Co-op estate farms and during the blitz on Leicester a lot of Ella's mother's family stayed with them for safety.

Ella gave birth to a daughter (Peggy) on 3rd January 1941 and a son (Colin) on 14th April 1945. In 1952 the family returned to Evington and they moved into the cottage adjoining Ella's mother's. In 1982, Peggy, Ella's daughter, was killed in a tsunami while on holiday in Malta. Peggy's two children were found on rocks alive.

Cedric died in 1995 and Ella stayed in Evington until she died of old age in 2008. Despite of all the trauma in Ella's life, she was always smiling and enjoyed her gardening and collections of photographs.

TREE PLANTED IN EVINGTON PARK FOR NATURE-FRIENDLY PARK AWARD



The campaigners created the award as a way of recognising the work that is being done to create space for nature in the city.

Hannah Wakley from Leicester Friends of the Earth said: "There is some excellent work happening in Leicester's parks to encourage wildlife. As more than one in seven of our native species are facing extinction, it is important that we make space for nature in our cities."

In the Summer of 2023, the campaigners visited parks in Leicester between 8 and 20 hectares in size. They assessed the type and health of habitats and recorded the species of plants, birds, and bats they found. A full report on their findings was written and shared with the City Council.

Leicester Friends of the Earth donated a native Crab Apple tree to celebrate the award, which will provide blossom for pollinating insects and fruit for the birds. The event was attended by Evington councillors Deepak Bajaj, Jenny Joannou, and Zuffar Haq, Police and Crime Commissioner Rupert Matthews and interested environmentalists.

Deputy City Mayor Cllr Elly Cutkelvin said "We work hard to ensure that our parks and open spaces are a haven for both people and wildlife".

"I'm delighted that Leicester Friends of the Earth will be planting a tree in Evington Park to acknowledge its designation as a nature-friendly park, and I hope that people will enjoy visiting their local park to discover the wildlife on their doorstep."

MAYFLOWER PRIMARY SCHOOL REPORT

The children, parents, governors and staff of Mayflower Primary School are excited to announce that after almost a year in temporary accommodation, we will be moving into our new premises on the Ethel Road Playing Fields from Monday 8th April 2024. This is a wonderful outcome as the RAAC crisis has resulted in our school being split across 4 sites during the summer term of 2023, and 2 sites since the beginning of the autumn term and beyond. This has been very hard for the children, who just want their school to come back together again.

The new site has been built in record time, and we would like to thank the DfE, Reds10, and the Local Authority for their outstanding work. The quality of the new building is truly excellent, and our children will also have open access to all of the green space on the aforementioned playing fields. We have a very strong belief in the effectiveness of outdoor education, and seeing our children in this wonderful natural environment will augment the quality of their learning and day-to-day experience of school.

Once we move out of the old site on Evington Drive, contractors from the DfE will be working hard to agree a forward plan. Pleasingly, our school has become part of the School Rebuilding Programme (SRP), and this could see a demolition and full rebuild. If this is the outcome, we will work hard to ensure that the New Mayflower Primary School reflects the core principles of the Eco-Schools Movement, utilising innovative building techniques that will give the building a net-zero carbon rating. Very exciting times indeed.

Our thanks, as always, to the Evington Community, especially those residents along Ethel Road, who have had to endure

so much disruption since the building project commenced. This has now come to an end and we promise to be the best neighbours ever!'



LCC'S IT AND PHONE SYSTEMS

Leicester City Council IT systems and phone lines have been temporarily shut down after an undisclosed cyber incident is investigated.

The council is announcing that they are now in the 'recovery phase'.

Leicester City Council's IT services and phone lines were shut on Thursday March 7th with major disruption caused to council services as a result. The director who is leading the council's recovery announced on March 13th that the disruption could last for "at least another two weeks".

Strategic Director of City Development and Neighbourhood Services, Richard Sword, gave this update regarding the incident.

"The good news is that we've now got the all-clear to start bringing our systems back online in a safe and controlled manner, and have formally entered the recovery phase of our response to this incident. Many people in Leicester will be frustrated by these ongoing issues, but I'd like to reassure them that we're working as quickly as possible to get things back to normal. I'd also like to apologise for the disruption and thank people for their continued patience and understanding as we work to resolve these outstanding issues."

The guidance for the public is to stay updated on the Leicester City Council's website (www.leicester.gov.uk) and if you want to get in contact with the council, there are emergency numbers available on their website.

Evington Park House was in private ownership until 1947, when Leicester Corporation purchased it from the last private owner, Thomas Sawday. The top floor of the House was then made into two flats upstairs for park-keepers and the downstairs rooms were used by bowls members.

The gardens were turned into a public

park and tennis courts and bowling greens were created. A pavilion was built by the bowling green for the use of members and was donated by Mr. H. T. Errington.

After the last park keeper vacated the flats in the 1980s, the upstairs was used as offices for Park Services; later there was also a room for the Police.

Some downstairs rooms were used for community activities.

In 2015, it looked as though the House would become a Community Centre under Transform in g Neighbourhood Services, with the upstairs rooms as offices for Park staff and the downstairs rooms for

community activities.

New lighting was installed along the pathway to the house with a new lamppost and better lighting in the park generally. The upstairs offices were redecorated and the downstairs rooms were fitted out with fire doors and there was first aid training for volunteers.

Friends of Evington supported this move, paying for the improvement of a small community kitchen called the Friends of Evington kitchen and later the repainting of the main kitchen. The Council built a new toilet block in the park too. New groups started to run in the evenings and daytime and a Community Access document was drawn up.

However, in December 2023 the remaining activity groups and Park Services staff were told to clear the house

of all belongings and leave because the house was surplus to the requirements of Leicester City Council. New venues had to be found for the remaining groups, but with Covid as well, the very popular Art in the Park group, the Gujarati games group and the Bicycle Club failed to survive the changes.

Friends of Evington continue to support the volunteers who lead the various activities that took place in Evington Park House and now take place at Mayflower Church rooms, the St. Denys' Parish Centre, the Village Hall and The Cedars.

Friends of Evington working with Best Community Charity would want to represent the community interests in obtaining Evington Park House under a community asset transfer.

We are asking for people who have skills and experience of facilitating a community project that includes fundraising, project management, stakeholder engagement, business planning and community engagement to email friendsofevington1@gmail.com indicating their interest and experience.

Our next steps would need to include organising consultations with residents in Evington to find out what services and activities they would like to see, bid writing to get proper 3D surveys done, which could be shared with all and developing a realsitic, workable business case that would convince everyone, including the Council, that this was a really viable and sustainable proposition.

local community and police would work together through Neighbourhood Watch groups, the Evington Echo, Meetings like this, Beat meetings, and contacting your often give away Faraday wallets, but they are easily purchased.

It you want to report a crime anonymously, use 'Crimestoppers'. Tel: 0800 555 111. This is a safe and totally anonymous way of reporting crime.

Use PIR sensors. These are devices that can detect when a human being walks past a sensor. (It works on detecting infrared radiation.) Keeping lights on all the time is less effective than this sensor which comes on when triggered.

Follow Neighbourhood Link and find out when your Beat Surgeries take place and much more. Neighbourhood Link is an easy, free email messaging service from Leicestershire Police, Neighbourhood Watch and other local partner organisations, providing news and updates on policing matters that are relevant to you.

Sign up to receive email alerts about police activity and initiatives in your local area, crime prevention advice and information and warnings about current scams and fraud. You'll have the opportunity to reply directly to your neighbourhood team and have your say on your local policing priorities.

Answering questions from the audience: there were so many questions. Here are a few replies:

The police assured residents that when a crime is reported, the victims should be updated. If the report is about anti-social behaviour then the person complaining should receive a follow-up phone call.

The officers explained how they concentrate on areas where they know criminals are working and the ways they identify these areas.

They explained that they can help if a car obstructs your driveway and you can't get out, but they don't help if the problem is that you can't get in.

Any littering is the responsibility of Leicester City Council, not the police. You can download an app. on your phone called 'Love Clean Streets' where you can report many street problems including fly



Dedicated Neighbourhood Officers.

The Evington area's Dedicated Neighbourhood Team (DNT) consists of five local police officers who are supported by other officers from the wider area. To be able to contact your local area officers search the internet for Leicestershire Police (leics.police.uk) and then fill in your postcode in the 'Find Your Area' box. Then the names of all your DNT team will be shown and you can contact them by email easily be adding @leics.police.uk. (e.g. John.Smith@leics.police.uk All police officers also have mobile numbers that are also on What's App.

Some good advice from the meeting: you can store your car keys in a tin or purchase a Faraday wallet. This means that thieves can't clone the signal. Police
