Artists at work at Headway


Volunteer artist, Helen Wilford, comes weekly to teach art and design at Headway. It's therapeutic art for the members, and carers are welcome to join in.

Editorial

This editorial highlights some ongoing and future activities of Friends of Evington in cooperation with partners, friends and the local authority. This incorporated charity manages this magazine, the Evington Echo website and Evington in Bloom, which promotes community and environmental activities in the Evington area.

The weekly lunch club at St. Denys Parish Centre is part of Best Community Charity's ongoing commitment, in partnership with Friends of Evington, to foster social connections in Leicester. There is now a waiting list for this group.

The Fun, Fitness, Zumba Dance group is led by Jyoti who is a very experienced instructor (see poster on page 3). Places are still available.

Evington residents are being consulted on their views about how the special character of Evington's Conservation Area (one of 25 in Leicester City) should be preserved or enhanced.

The advertisements below invite you to two events - A Consultation Drop-In on 30th April from 5.00pm to 8.00pm at St. Denys Parish Centre and a Patch Walk on Thursday 1st May from 6.30pm to 8.30pm.

Linked to the proposed new management plan, the Leicester City Council is also consulting on introducing a new Article 4 Direction. This would give the Council more powers to help protect the distinctive character of properties in this area. There are minor changes proposed to the conservation area boundary as well.

The Council has also recently confirmed new Article 4 Directions for the conservation areas in Braunstone and Knighton villages, introduced after similar consultations and as part of new management plans for these areas which were published last autumn. A range of other enhancement works to those areas has been completed, including new signage, removal of street clutter, fencing repairs, new planting and other improvements.

Return Our Services to Evington Village



An Action Team has been established to fight for the re-establishment of our services, including the GP branch surgery and pharmacy. These services were removed without proper consideration of the consequences and without proper due diligence of the alternatives.

We aim to have a rolling programme of actions and events during 2025 to persuade the Integrated Care Board (the NHS Local body) and the City Council, who could have intervened under powers bestowed on them by Parliament in January 2024, to rethink this.

We cannot do it without people power as we are simply a body of concerned citizens. WE NEED YOU to help us get the services you deserve back into the locality. There are GPs willing to re-establish our local service, but the integrated Care Board is standing in their way and the City Council stands idly by.

Our plans include:

3. A Log of individual cases of 'hardship', service deficit
4. A Survey of traders
5. A Petition from traders





On the eve of the holy month of Ramadan Mr Najeeb Patel, Chairman and Ameer of Goodwood Islamic Centre, issued a timely reminder about social responsibility. CLLR. ZUFFAR HAQ'S REPORT



These are some of the tasks I have undertaken during the last few weeks as an Evington Ward Councillor.

* Supported by my team, Nitesh Dave and Farida Patel, my Saturday surgery for residents continues to take place on Saturdays at 11 o'clock at the Eden café in Evington.

* Have attended council meetings at the Town Hall and City Hall and surgeries for residents, at the Evington library.

* Attended the Rehma Mercy anniversary charity event.

* Attended the Holocaust Memorial Day commemoration event.

* Trying to get more funding for Leicester's NHS hospitals now. All our neighbouring cities have already had funding for the NHS and over recent years have had new state of the art hospitals built. Leicester was promised funding to upgrade our hospitals several years ago. Sadly this funding date has been pushed further and further ahead and we are missing out on upgrades to our hospital buildings, equipment and services. Leicester deserves better!

* Attended the launch event of "A world

of colour and Emotion" at Leicester Museum and Art Gallery.

* Having recently visited the LRI and seen the huge number of patients in A&E and on the wards. I organised a coffee van to visit as a thank you to the hard-working staff who are stretched to the limit.

* Invited as a speaker on BBC Radio Leicester talking about Cancelled Operations and Radio Ramadan about Fostering.

* Visited a Ramadan Festival.

I continue to carry out casework, leading from residents' requests for help or support with issues or problems that concern them.

I attended a meeting regarding the proposed cancellation of transport for children with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND), to oppose the withdrawal of this service.

At the Ward meeting, the agenda included a presentation given by the Golden Token community group, from Rowlatts Hill, about the services they offer. Also an update from the Highways and Housing Departments.

I continue to actively support our local schools and keep them informed about potential funding and other opportunities.

I'm still being approached by residents who are very concerned and upset by closure of the doctors' surgery and pharmacy in Evington and have arranged to meet with members of the Integrated Care Board about this unsatisfactory situation.

I continue to work hard to support residents and communities in our area.

THE GOLDEN TOKEN YOUTH CLUB




The Golden Token Youth Club was previously a shop at 41 Radstone Walk, now given a new life by being converted into a vital community centre for the people of Rowlatts Hill. Founded by Dujana Nasir, it provides somewhere for locals both young and old to stay and connect, and offers the practical help necessary to improve the lives and futures of the young people living there. The facilities on-site include a seating area and kitchenette, teaching area, computer hub and

even a pool table for all to use. While this community centre had started off as a small project of a university student, it has met success in its primary goal of getting the local young people off the streets, and now even attracts attendees from wider areas too.

HILLSIDE UNITED

This youth club offers a variety of activities for its young people to allow them access to work and personal development through helping them build life skills and confidence. A weekly football club has been set up by Golden Token for the local kids, who have named their team 'Hillside United', using Humberstone Park to meet up and play every Saturday, for 10 year olds. For Ala, the football club has become one of her favourite activities to come from the centre, and she has made many friends and even learnt how to play pool!



SKILLS GUIDANCE

It also aids in improving the employability of young people from the ages of 16 to 20 years old, by giving them access to online certifications, first aid course certificates, and in-person help in improving CVs to really showcase their skills. What Golden Token wants to achieve through programmes like this, is to allow young people access to real-life opportunities and give them a sustainable future in work and employment. Great importance is placed on mentoring and giving the youth a place to develop themselves in their own way, as shown through their entrepreneurship programme, which provides advice, guidance, and grants of up to £100 per person to the club's own young people, to help them start their own businesses and find success in whichever industry they set their sights on. Further help is provided, focused on improving young people's digital skills in an increasingly digital world.

DIVERSITY AND INCLUSION

Visits from police have been organised to help foster trust between the youth and law enforcement, in addition to much more community work, such as providing local refugee support, help filling in forms, and making a place for kids to hang out and creatively express themselves through making music such as rap. The main focus at this youth club isn't on any particular race, religion, or interpersonal differences, but rather on fostering an environment of both diversity and community inclusion.

The Golden Token Youth Club continued

MAPPING A PATH TO SUCCESS

Dujana Nasir - also known as DJ - is the founder of Golden Token and of this centre, contributing much of his own time and resources into converting an old shop into a vibrant and useful community centre. As an economics student, he used his own money and loans to build up this centre from scratch with the aid of a few friends. While he used to live in Highfields, when he moved to Rowlatts Hill, he found the state of the neighbourhood in need of action, and what he wanted to do was help out young people by fixing the root cause of the problem to reduce antisocial behaviour and give them a path to make themselves successful.

MENTORING

He draws inspiration for this club from his own youth and the help that he received, which allowed him to fulfill his potential with his GCSEs and go on to study at university. DJ states that he was drawn into social work out of necessity and a desire to improve his own local area. He is

now joined by many volunteers, including Ariyan, who helps out with running the sessions that the community centre offers, such as coaching football. A local mother, Indy, says the community centre has helped the progression of the

mentoring

area for young people by providing a secure place for them with mentors that really bring out the kids' own lively personalities.

YOUTH VOICES MATTER

What Golden Token Youth Club really wants is to inspire young people and 'show kids their voice matters' by allowing them to give their own opinions in a space in which they will be heard, to then allow them to grow into practical and successful young adults. However, this community centre still remains a modest, grassroots organisation focused on doing what they can with the resources they can get, meaning that the more they have access to, the greater the impact they can have across residents of all walks of life. Since the area of Rowlatts Hill is composed primarily of council housing and divided between two wards, this has caused a barrier to funding that could be really appreciated when trying to keep a community centre based around reducing the level of local antisocial behaviour and making a real difference in the lives of young people thriving.

A FUN DAY IN JULY

Amongst aims to expand their impact across a wider range of expertise that the current volunteers don't have access to, Golden Token hopes to set up Rowlatts Hill's first ever 'Family Fun Day' in the coming July, a plan reliant on further support from community charities, agencies, and councillors, that would include various food stalls, entertainment and fun activities for children, as well as providing another way to secure funding for the vital community centre to ramp up its effect.

Kalpesh Nagar is Head of Mathematics at Moat Community College and he has strong personal connections with Evington. He shares some fascinating and fun facts about the number 2025.

2025 is a PERFECT SQUARE

$$45^2 = 45 \times 45 = 2025$$

(The next year to be a perfect square is 91 years away! $46^2 = 2116$... wow!)

- $2025 = \text{Sum of three squares}$
 $5^2 + 20^2 + 40^2 = 2025$

- $2025 = \text{Sum of cube numbers from 1-9}$
 $1^3 + 2^3 + 3^3 + 4^3 + 5^3 + 6^3 + 7^3 + 8^3 + 9^3 = 2025$

- 2025 is a Harshad Number (aka Niven number)



CARTER FOR THE BIG 'UN

Ali Carter is a good, clean potter, one of the best in the game (along with Ronnie O'Sullivan and Mark Williams) and a strong breakbuilder. He has got a solid safety game too and is a 6 time ranking tournament winner.

I think he still concedes frames too easily when he only needs 1 or 2 snookers and doesn't scrap some of the frames out when he should.

A prime example of this came in the World Championships a few years ago when he played Gary Wilson in Quarter finals. For me, he conceded too easily in at least 2 frames if not 3 (a bit more scrap in them and who knew?).

He had of course defeated O'Sullivan by 13 frames to 9 in the second round of the 2018 tournament. If he could take O'Sullivan he could Wilson surely. He also ran O'Sullivan fairly close in the 2024 Masters final, nip and tuck with him for most of it and has runnered up two World finals to him in 2008 and 2012. For some reason I thought they would be back to contest the World Final that year but it never materialised. He's due one with O'Sullivan and good luck to him.

An encouraging semi-final run and a good match with Stephen Maguire in the Welsh Open along with a World Open semi final (victory over Jack Lisowski 5-4 in round 2)

shows that Carter might just be returning to form at the right time.


So what of the others? Well, it was very much Shaun Murphy's Masters this year, as well as he's played in a tournament in a long while and a maximum down in it as well.

Kyren Wilson has 3 Ranking titles this season and is the defending World Champion while David Gilbert ran the semi final in 2019 (a cracker with John Higgins which he probably should have won) and again in 2024. Could he be a dark horse? He plays attacking, good to watch snooker on his day.

I remember Jack Lisowski playing in the best 2 matches of the 2022 World Championships, both of them going all the way, 13-12 over Neil Robertson then down by the same scoreline to John Higgins in the Quarter Finals. A very fluent potter and breakbuilder on his day. An interesting match came in Round 2 of the World Open between Ali Carter and Jack Lisowski with Carter prevailing by 5 frames to 4.

Mark Selby has won it 4 times, runnered it up in 2023 and has won the Welsh Open recently while Ronnie O'Sullivan hasn't played all season but is good enough and daft enough to win.


