As a community-run publication, we strive to provide a platform for diverse voices and perspectives, in line with our charitable objects and commitment to neutrality. We have reviewed our editorial approach to ensure our content remains balanced and inclusive. Unfortunately, this means we can no longer publish articles submitted by individual councillors. We appreciate the efforts of all our local representatives in supporting community initiatives and events.

COMPUTALA



Computala was an exhibition at LCB Depot in Leicester that brought together artists working with digital technology, artificial intelligence, and robotics. Running throughout January, it explored how creative work is changing as computers and automated systems become part of everyday life.

Rather than presenting technology as simply good or bad, the exhibition asked practical questions. What happens to creativity when machines can generate images, music, or text? How do artists stay in control of their ideas while using new tools? The works on display included visual installations, interactive pieces, sound-based projects, and performances.

Computala was organised by New Media Art Club and featured artists from Leicester, across the UK and internationally. Alongside the exhibition, there were workshops, talks and events designed to help people of different ages engage with these ideas.

The exhibition was open to the public at LCB Depot on Rutland Street, Leicester.

WORLD LANGUAGE DAY 2026

21st February

Did you know The Language Movement had a major cultural impact on Bengali society? It has inspired the development and celebration of the Bengali language, literature and culture.

16th December 1971 marked the Victory of freedom fighters after a very bloody period, where it is estimated that the previous nine months of conflict caused the loss of life of an estimated 3 million people. At the Ramna Race Course in Dhaka, Bangladesh, 81 thousand soldiers capitulated, and this is recognised as the largest military capitulation since WWII and the birth of Bangladesh.

After further laws prohibited the use of diverse languages, a proposal from Bangladesh was sent to the 30th General Conference of UNESCO on 17th November 1999 to declare 21 February as International Mother Language Day, this was unanimously supported.

Evington is proud to be home to residents who speak many different languages. Language is more than words—it's

identity, heritage and belonging. In a neighbourhood as diverse as ours, it's also a reminder that kindness and understanding can begin with something as simple as greeting someone in their own language, sharing a phrase, or listening with patience when English isn't someone's first language.

'NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH', 'IT'S YOUR NEIGHBOURHOOD' AND 'ENJOYABLY EVINGTON'

The pictures on the front cover show roads linked to 'Neighbourhood Watch', 'It's Your Neighbourhood', or to residents who litter-pick as part of 'Enjoyably Evington'.

The roads featured are: Main Street, High Street, Church Road, Spencefield Lane, Evington Road, Delaware Road, Downing Drive, Sedgebrook Road, Earlswood Road, Thurnview Road, Goodwood Road, Greenacre Drive, Davenport Road, Harringworth Road, and Goodwood Crescent.

'Neighbourhood Watch'

Neighbourhood Watch groups work with a coordinator (a local resident) and neighbours, to share information and provide support.

'It's Your Neighbourhood'

The idea for these groups in England and Wales came from the Royal Horticultural Society and they are administered by regional teams. In our area the regional team is called East Midlands in Bloom.

Very local groups (a road, or a small collection of roads) work together around three pillars: community, environmental responsibility, and gardening, usually on land where they have permission to garden. Roads aren't in competition with each other; instead, they work to improve standards and receive yearly feedback

from judges.

'Enjoyably Evington'

Everyone can help look after our local environment in their own way. Every little bit helps-and it all makes a difference. Around Evington, many people regularly go out collecting litter, but more hands are always needed and appreciated. Some of us go out by ourselves; some prefer to go out with others. Addy Tyler tries to go out for an hour or two once or twice a week around her local streets and through the village. Others pick up litter every day while walking the dog-it's amazing how much they collect.

One "Womble" goes out daily with his dog Rango. Over the last year he has collected thousands of bags of litter and large numbers of nitrous oxide cylinders, as well as cleaning road signs, unblocking drains, and removing graffiti. Despite living further afield, he regularly tidies Shady Lane and the area around Evington.

We've also had other visitors helping out: one from Wigston picked 19 bags on Rowllatts Hill Road on a Sunday morning, and another from Bushby is often seen tidying around the village. We are incredibly grateful to them-and they don't even live here.

We do need more residents to get involved to keep our community clean. Even a quick tidy near your house on bin day, or "adopting" your own street, makes a real difference.

Equipment: litter-pickers aren't expensive,

or you can request a free picker (with bags) from parks@leicester.gov.uk.

Want to join a group? Let us know on the Evington Litter Wombles Facebook page-Addy hopes to organise a few group picks soon.

* South Leicestershire Litter Wombles organise group picks each Sunday morning on our side of the city.

* The Wednesday Wombles meet most Wednesday mornings closer to home. (Both are advertised on the South Leicester and Leicestershire Facebook page.)

We'd also like to run a blitz around the village-giving signs and other street furniture a bit of a facelift. If you'd like to help, contact Addy or Helen through the Echo.

EUROPEAN TWINNING ASSOCIATION

THE STOUGHTON GRANGE ESTATE



Stoughton Grange Estate is promoted today as a centre of 'boutique rural commerce', but the land has a long and complex history.

After the First World War, the Co-operative Wholesale Society Ltd bought most of the estate in 1919, creating one of the largest farming enterprises in Great Britain. In 2014, the Wellcome Trust (through Farmcare) purchased most of the Co-op's local landholdings, a move that prompted debate about the future of farming.

In the post-Covid period, Steamin' Billy Co. Ltd became involved in acquiring and leasing back parts of the remaining Grange Estate, helping shape the site's current redevelopment.

COUNCILLOR MANJULA SOOD MBE

23 December 1945 – 24 December 2025

Manjula's city was definitely Leicester, where she took a keen interest in all its stories. She loved meeting people and did what she could to bring communities together, always ready with a kind word, practical support and time to listen.

She was involved in many Evington events, including the Evington Village Fete and Show, and she recently thoroughly enjoyed her visit to Evington at the Lunch Club at St Denys Parish Centre on 9th April 2025.

Manjula was born in India and later lived in Tanzania before coming to Leicester with her new husband, Paul Sood, in 1970. At first, she found the cold, damp weather difficult, and her early living conditions were very challenging. However, following her grandfather's advice to make the best of her new home, she enrolled on a Postgraduate Certificate

of Education course at Leicester's School of Education and went on to teach for the next 20 years.

As an Asian teacher, Manjula championed the recognition of Indian culture and helped children feel proud of who they were, particularly at a time when newly arrived families—including refugees from Idi Amin's Uganda—were building new lives in Leicester. She believed that schools should reflect the communities they serve, and she worked to ensure that pupils and parents felt welcomed, respected and included.

A profoundly difficult period came with the death of her husband, Councillor Paul Sood, in 1996. He had been a councillor for Abbey Ward (now Latimer Ward). Her younger son persuaded Manjula to stand in the by-election, saying it would be the best tribute she could pay to Paul's memory. She won convincingly and, later that year, became Leicester City's first female Asian councillor.

This marked the start of an illustrious career in public service. Manjula served as Lord Mayor of Leicester from May 2008 to May 2009, becoming the first Asian female Lord Mayor in the UK. During and around her year in office she was appointed an MBE for services to the community and also received an honorary doctorate (Doctor of Laws) from the University of Leicester.

She served as a councillor for Belgrave for many years and returned to the council in 2023 as councillor for Stoneygate. Manjula continued to serve the city in a wide range of roles, including trustee and executive director of the Leicester Council of Faiths, where she was passionate about promoting understanding between religions.

Her co-councillor Raffiq Mahommed said

"Manjula was a true community champion who always saw the best in everyone. She believed deeply in people, in unity, and in bringing communities together. Through her selfless service—first as a teacher, then as a councillor—she helped others realise their potential and create a strong sense of belonging. Manjula's legacy lives on in the many lives she touched and the community she so lovingly served. The Stoneygate and Evington community have truly lost one of their own, and she will be missed by all her family and those whose lives she touched."

Tributes have been pouring in for Manjula. Her funeral was held on Saturday 10th January 2026, following a special cortege through the city with stops that allowed friends and residents to pay their respects.

PILGRIMS' FRIEND SOCIETY IN EVINGTON



Theme: Hibernating in Winter. This picture shows residents making muffins that illustrate the theme.

Barbara is the Activity and Community Engagement (ACE) Facilitator at the Pilgrims' Friend Society Care Home, based in Evington, just off Grocot Road.

The 30-bed home supports 23 elderly Christian residents, known as "Family Members". The youngest is 68 and the oldest is in their 90s. Alongside the care home in an adjacent building; the project also includes independent living accommodation.

Barbara outlined the home's wide-ranging programme of activities and highlighted its strong volunteer support network. Activities include poetry, singing (with musical instruments), "Singing for Wellbeing", devotional speakers and Sunday services, seated exercises, film afternoons, games of all kinds, monthly

outings, and a variety of crafts including cooking. Family Members also enjoy celebrating national events (such as the Olympics), as well as birthday celebrations tailored to individuals' interests—often with dressing up, bingo, and even "messy play".

Theme days are another popular feature. (See the photo to the left). Barbara emphasised that choice is central to daily life at the home. She also introduced Eve Webb, the Wellbeing and Dementia staff member. Eve explained the home's "Hummingbirds" programme—named because hummingbirds "flit around"—which provides meaningful activities while upholding dignity at all times. The team takes care to learn as much as possible about each person, their life story, and their preferences, keeping dignity at the heart of everything they do. This approach extends to mealtimes, where there are always choices available.

Around 20 volunteers support the home, including local community groups (such as Knit and Natter), local schools (including St Paul's and Kiddycraft), and individual volunteers. All volunteers are trained and DBS-checked, and they assist with outings and the events and activities described above.

The care home also has a garden, previously featured in Evington Echo. Barbara would welcome volunteers who could help develop and maintain this space for the benefit of Family Members.

ALEX PORTLOCK COMES BACK TO EVINGTON

In early 2023, Alex Portlock, a trainee journalist from Nîmes, France, completed a fortnight's internship with the Evington Echo. During her time in Evington she met many local people and explored a wide range of stories, including French Leicester, fair-trade chocolate, the Sedgebrook Open Space project, and other media organisations across Leicester.

This January, Alex returned to the area while visiting her grandparents in Uppingham. She also took time to indulge her love of English charity shops and made a quick stop at The Cedars in Evington to catch up with Evington Echo community reporter Harkesh Farma.

Asked about Evington, Alex said she felt the same strong sense of community as she had on her previous visit. She also mentioned that the article in the last edition, "Disliking Evington", caught her attention. Alex agreed it is important to acknowledge and confront the less pleasant realities of an area, because that is how improvements can be made—by working together, finding new solutions, and applying for funding.

Alex added that she was surprised Evington does not have a community centre, given how many people live in the area and how much is happening locally.

HISTORY AND HERITAGE TALK – ST MARGARET’S AND WOODGATE, LEICESTER



Trevor Allen returned to the History and Heritage Group this January to give an illustrated talk on the St Margaret’s and Woodgate areas of Leicester. A former history teacher at Leicester

Grammar School, Trevor is now retired and supports Leicester City Council’s Choose How You Move programme. As part of this, he leads a series of well-researched and popular guided walks around the city.

His talk ranged widely across local history, including St Margaret’s Church—its Saxon remains and the many times it has been rebuilt - Andrew Lloyd and his career in the West Indies; Corah’s factory, and Lesley Corah, who was killed in the First World War. He also spoke about the old Board School on Slater Street, and the Frisby and Jarvis building, which bears a plaque to Len Wickwark. Wickwark fought 473 professional bouts—believed to be the most ever recorded.

This article, however, will focus on Mary Royce (1845–1892). Mary has a blue plaque stating that she was the founder of the Royce Institute and Leicester’s first woman doctor. “Well,” said Trevor, “that is really underselling a woman!”

Mary came from a wealthy, nonconformist family living in Gallowtree Gate. She became a Sunday school teacher at the Congregational Chapel, teaching poor boys in the area and giving them a basic education. Then, in 1879, she used her own money to set up the Royce Institute, extending learning to art, music and sport for around 100 boys.

Following the 1876 Parliamentary Act that allowed women to become doctors, Mary began her medical training in London in 1881 and qualified in 1890.

That may seem a long time, but she needed time out along the way. Once qualified, she threw herself into caring for the poor and sick, working tirelessly until her death in 1892, after catching smallpox in the Poor House.

SURGERY UPDATE



Builders have been hard at work at 10 The Common, Evington. Formerly owned by Dr. Wood and used as a surgery, the building is currently being refitted.

Following Dr. Wood’s retirement, the property was sold to a private individual who hoped to lease it as a GP surgery or for other business use. However, no interested GPs took this forward, and the building has now been leased as an office for a company that runs care homes.

R.O.S.E. (Retain Our Services, Evington) intends to continue campaigning for the NHS Integrated Care Board to restore a GP surgery in Evington.

MAPS - FINDING INFORMATION

maps.leicester.gov.uk is Leicester City Council’s online mapping portal, designed to help residents quickly find trusted, property-linked information. By searching an address or postcode, you can view an interactive map and switch on layers that reveal what’s nearby and what could influence a home now or in the future. It’s especially useful for day-to-day queries—such as locating the nearest parks, schools, public transport routes, and other local services—and for getting a clearer picture of boundaries and site locations than you might from a standard map app.

For anyone considering moving, the portal can also support early-stage due diligence. Depending on the layers available, you may be able to view planning applications and decisions in the surrounding area, as well as conservation areas, listed buildings, or other heritage-related designations.

From an admin perspective, it’s a practical starting point for gathering background information consistently and efficiently, before escalating questions to the right service area.

However, it should be used as a research tool rather than a final authority. Always confirm key findings through the official planning pages and, where appropriate, seek professional advice (for example, from planning consultants, surveyors, or legal representatives).

DOCTOR IN THE PARK

During the 1891 census - while transcribing Evington records during lockdown - I was surprised to find unusually ‘international’ residents living at Evington House: a young Australian doctor who served as Leicester’s Medical Officer of Health (MOH), his Russian-born wife, and a Swiss maid.

After Miss Henry Ann Burnaby (Colonel John Burnaby’s last surviving unmarried daughter) died in 1888, Evington House was no longer occupied by the family and was instead rented out to a series of tenants on short leases. One such tenant was Dr John Andrew Turner. Dr. Turner graduated from Edinburgh Medical School in 1882, he had previously held a post in Stony Stanton, and developed a strong interest in public health and sanitation. This interest shaped his career as he was appointed Medical Officer of Health for Leicestershire and Rutland at the end of 1888.

Turner’s wife, Vera, was born in St Petersburg on 31 December 1861. Although Russian-born, she came from a British family. Her father, William Blake Lambert, was a prominent marine engineer who became Engineer-in-Chief to the Imperial Russian Navy during the modernisation period under Tsar Alexander II.

The household also included a Swiss maid, Emma Treudiger. Many Swiss people of the era were multilingual (often German and French, sometimes Italian). Experience in English domestic service could provide strong English skills and cultural knowledge—assets that could later support work in Switzerland’s hotel trade.

I also found out about Dr Turner’s Australian background: he was one of five sons of a Sydney businessman (also named John Andrew Turner), an auctioneer and trader in wool and hides. The family experienced tragedy in 1870 when Dr. Turner’s father died by suicide, after which his widowed mother moved the children to England for schooling, enabling prestigious university paths (Edinburgh, Oxford, and Cambridge).
